"The proud history of Canada's military women began in 1885 during the North-West Rebellion when 12 nursing sisters served in the army field hospitals in Saskatoon and Moose Jaw....Once World War II broke out, the government found that it needed women to serve in support jobs in order to free the men for combat. Women served so men could fight...A total of 50,000 Canadian women pioneers proved that women were capable of much more than tradition, and men, had ever thought" (First In Last Out, Glad Bryce). The stories, lives and experiences of the women are a very special part of Canada's social and military history. The many contributions to the war effort need to be told and retold. There are far too few of these brave women left to thank. **Help us tell the stories.**
