that was inspiring.




World War II veteran Irene Sobering attended and stood next to her army uniform on display. She wore it when she joined the military reserves (1960) during the period of the Cold War as a member of Canadian Army Ordnance Corps and served for 16 years.

Irene joined the RCAF January 1942 in Winnipeg. A total of 17,038 women enlisted with the Women's Division during World War II but only about 1500 served overseas. It was during her time in London, England that she met her future husband George Sobering. George was an RCAF Lancaster pilot. They retired in Jerseyville.
