## Report from the Chair

#### 2024 WAS OUR 31st YEAR WITH LOTS TO CELEBRATE



Since opening in March, attendance steadily grew with positive responses from our visitors both in their generosity in the donation box and reviews online.

Major displays were the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Royal Canadian Air Force; the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D-Day; the invasion of Normandy in 1944 and the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of NATO.

**2025 THEME** – Recognizing the service of the men and women of the Royal Canadian Navy and Merchant Marine.

The WWI exhibit will be redesigned showcasing our rare WWI collections.

We hosted 21 tours with more than 1700 visitors coming with tours and events alone. This does not include numbers for the Open House, Car Show, and the weekend visitors from March to the end of November, which has seen a substantial increase. So...you could more than double the 1700 number.




